Dear Neighbors,




Welcome back from what we hope was a relaxing and enjoyable summer! As we ease into the cooler months, we're excited to reconnect with everyone and share some upcoming community news.

As for a potential residential parking program, the City passed an ordinance in the spring that allows such a program to be created. However, we are still waiting on specific information from the City about how the program would work. Outstanding questions include but are not limited to: How many parking passes per household? How many guest passes? How will the city differentiate between non-residents and approved construction vehicles? How, specificially, does the neighborhood or street demostrate there is an exisiting parking problem with non-residents? The Board asked these questions over a year ago to the City while in discussion about the program.

Thank you for your continued involvement in making our neighborhood a vibrant and welcoming place. We look forward to seeing everyone at the block party and to a wonderful season ahead!



Pricing

- Business card: \$25 per ad / \$100 per year
- Quarter page: \$50 per ad / \$200 per year
- ½ page: \$100 per ad / \$400 per year
- Whole page: \$200 per ad / \$800 per year

Placement:

Ads will be be placed 1-4 times a year and placed after the 2nd page. There is no guaranteed placement location.

Discounts:

10% discount if you pay for an ad for the entire year upfront.

• Example: if you pay upfront for a quarter page ad priced at \$50/ad, or \$200/year, (4 times/year), you will receive a \$20 discount and only pay \$180.

Hurricane Readiness Guide

As we are currently in the peak of hurricane season, here are few helpful reminders to keep yourself and your loved ones safe.

- Yard debris: you should keep your trees and shrubs in good trim now, since no green waste piles can be left out when a storm approaches. Keeping the streets clean of debris during the rainy season but especially during a storm is very important as the debris flows into the drains and causes Flagler to flood. Please remind your gardeners to remove the clippings and yard waste, even on Monday night, before the City picks up on Tuesday.
- <u>Know your Evacuation Zone</u>: https://floridadisaster.org/knowyourzone
- <u>Gather Supplies</u>: Have enough food, water, and other supplies for every member of your family to last at least 72 hours.
- <u>Make an Emergency Plan</u>: Make sure everyone in your household understands your hurricane plan.
- <u>Stay Informed</u>: Know where to go for trusted sources of information during a hurricane event.
- <u>Special Needs Shelters</u>: You must register with PBC in advance. Please call (561) 712-6400.

South Dixie Highway Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR) Project Meeting

Purpose of the Project: To extend the service life of the pavement, enhance roadway safety, improve operating characteristics of the corridor, and to address Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) deficiencies to promote a safer environment to all modes of transportation.

Anticipated Start: Spring 2026

Anticipated Completion: Spring 2027

Scope of Work:

- Repave and restripe the existing roadway
- Construct a new signalized crosswalk just north of Vallette Way
- Upgrade lighting at the signalized intersection of Flamingo Drive
- Install school zone with overhead flashing beacons in the vicinity of Flamingo Drive
- Upgrade pedestrian signalization

Estimated Construction Cost: \$3.9 million

Construction Impacts:

- Single lane closures will occur during non-peak hours
- Nighttime detours will occur within the project limits
- Access to properties along the corridor will be maintained at all times
- Work will be done in phases to reduce the effects of construction on the community

Public Meeting: Thursday, October 10, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. at The Norton Museum and will be offered in-person and virtually simultaneously.
